Once you find the perfect pair of boots you don't want to be without them. Look after them and you should get several seasons' wear out of them.

A riding-style boot is a perfect wardrobe perennial. Russell and Bromley's 50/50 boot (£365) is a great example and a fashion favourite. Found in the wardrobes of many A-listers, including Olivia Palermo and Angelina Jolie, this is this season's wine suede version.

The over-the-knee 50/50 combines a suede, or leather, front panel with a super-soft elastic back panel. Not only are they very comfortable they are also very flattering and the clever design means that they fit most calves.

Russell & Bromley has also just introduced its little sister, the half and half (£355) which is basically a knee length
